


# **Project Mañana's Annual Report**



### Summary

Project Mañana International completed its second full year of service on September 30, 2012. In looking at 2012, as a calendar year, we couldn't be more pleased and encouraged by the success we've had. ## **Get Involved**





#### Growth:

- Project Mañana grew from serving 115 children in 2011 to 225 children in 2012 (That's a 122% annual increase -- and a 650% increase since we started in 2010!).
- Project Mañana has 3 direct Dominican employees and 8 indirect Dominican employees through the school
- Project Mañana has helped to hire a school director, school secretary, and 2 additional teachers
- ▶ Project Mañana (through sponsorship) was able to purchase its first vehicle (Photo)

#### Financial:

- Project Mañana's executive leadership still maintains not to take any salary or compensation
- Project Mañana finished 2012 with 138 Individual and Corporate sponsors (a 94% increase since 2011)
- Project Mañana's executive leadership fulfilled it's pledge to donating \$500 (\$1 for every "Like" on Facebook, up to \$500)

#### Projects:

- ▶ Project Mañana built a 400 sq. ft. industrial kitchen on the school grounds (Video)
- Project Mañana helped purchase (or refurbished) additional student desks and tables
- Project Mañana provided school uniforms, text books, and supplies for students
- Project Mañana painted the exterior school walls
- Project Mañana adopted a new community (Villa Gonzales) and provided Christmas gifts to 43 children
- The administration of the Good Samaritan School built a basketball court without any funding from Project Mañana (Video)

#### Events:

- ▶ Project Mañana students celebrated their independence with a parade (Read More)
- Project Mañana hosted a day of stories, singing, & art in 2 locations (<u>Video 1</u>, <u>Video 2</u>)

#### Visitors:
